

Emily Smith Medallion *Named in honor of distinguished Mary Baldwin University alumna Emily Vance Pancake Smith 1906, this award was created by the Mary Baldwin Board of Trustees to recognize alumni who have made outstanding contributions to the university, their churches, communities, and beyond.*

C. Lindsay Ryland '73 Lindsay Ryland, Class of '73, credits Mary Baldwin for whetting her appetite for lifelong learning. Her professional career spanned such diverse positions as director of transition ministry for the Episcopal Diocese of Virginia and senior vice president of Bank of America. She served as president of the Richmond chapter of the National Association of Bank Women and held offices in both the Junior League of Richmond and the Hanover County Historical Society. Lindsay has held various professional society memberships and offices within the Episcopal church, where she remains active. Her many volunteer activities have included the United Way, Habitat for Humanity, the Memorial Child Guidance Clinic, and Virginia Voice. She is a former Emily Wising Kelly Leadership Award winner, Mary Baldwin Alumni Association president, and member of the Alumni Association Board. She was also a proud board member of the Richmond Alumni Chapter from 1974-2003.



Emily Wirsing Kelly Leadership Award *Emily Wirsing Kelly '63, artist and former Alumni Association Board of Directors President, passed away in 1985. Her husband Timothy Kelly established a leadership award and student scholarship in her memory through the Kelly Foundation. The Emily Wirsing Kelly Leadership Award recognizes alumni who have demonstrated outstanding service and excellence in leadership on behalf of Mary Baldwin University.*

Theresa Cash Lewis '99 Theresa Lewis, Class of '99, leads a senior team of professionals as Treasurer – Secretary for the Mutual Assurance Society of Virginia. Her responsibilities include accounting and reporting, human resources, and risk mitigation. In her position, she also participates in the corporate strategic planning process and provides advice on critical issues. She has served on the board of directors for Read Aloud Richmond and held various positions on both Mary Baldwin's Alumni Association Board and Board of Trustees. She proudly served the Alumni Board for eight years and served as president from 2016-2018. Theresa continues to be active in the Junior League of Richmond, where she has held many leadership positions.

Service to Community Award *This award recognizes alumni who provide distinguished and outstanding volunteer service to their communities and bring honor to their alma mater through their activities.*

Sally Dupree Barnett '63 Sally Barnett, Class of '63, has devoted her life to the challenge that "to whom much is given, much is required." A champion of childhood literacy, Sally worked for nearly 40 years as a librarian and teacher on two continents, as well as the Marshall Islands, while her husband Ron served in the military. She was recognized by the Huntsville, Alabama Women's Economic Development Council as Outstanding Woman in the Humanities in 2005. Sally continues serving others as a leader in local and global outreach through her church and as board member for the Women's Guild Huntsville Museum of Art, where she received the Doris Darling Award for service in 2009. From 2008-2013, Sally served as an officer for the Class of '63.



Service to Community of Faith Award *This award was created in 1986 by the Mary Baldwin University Alumni Association to honor alumni who have provided distinguished service to their faith and spiritual communities.*

Lida Angier "Angie" Brock '69 Angier Brock, Class of '69, works to combine her faith with the power of music and literature. She has written hymn and anthem texts in collaboration with American and British composers, one of which was performed on Easter Sunday 2018 by the choir of Sheffield Cathedral, England. An active member of Grace Episcopal Church in Yorktown, Virginia, Angier has led workshops at Shrine Mont's tri-diocesan fall camps and the Diocese of Southern Virginia's annual summer adult education conference. She also writes a monthly blog and develops women's retreats for Lumunos, an organization focused on enhancing well-being. She served on the Alumni Board of Directors from 1976-1978 and she has served as a class secretary for her class since 2014.



Career Achievement Award *Created in 1986 by the Mary Baldwin University Alumni Association, this award recognizes alumni whose outstanding career performance demonstrates the value of a liberal arts education, serves as an inspiration for current students, and brings distinction to the university and alumni.*

Lee Johnston Foster '75 Lee Foster, Class of '75, has devoted more than 30 years of service to the College of William & Mary, primarily in university advancement. She held the position of executive director of principal gifts and foundation operations, overseeing the management of principal gifts prospects, leading donor strategy and stewardship, and helping to ensure the success of the current campaign. Lee was instrumental in planning a women and philanthropy program at William & Mary, including creating the Society of 1918, a giving society that now has nearly 400 members. William & Mary named her an honorary alumna in 2013 and recently elected her a trustee emerita. She served Mary Baldwin as the executive director of Alumnae Affairs from 1982-1988; a member of the Class of 1975 Reunion Committee; Nominating Committee Chair, 1998-2000; National Chairperson for the Annual Fund, 1990-91; and a Sesquicentennial Campaign regional volunteer, 1990-92. She was also a member of the Alumni Association Board of Directors from 1996-2001.

Tiffany Elizabeth Hamm '89 Tiffany Hamm, Class of '89, stands on the frontlines of the war against AIDS and HIV as director for global health at the Henry M. Jackson Foundation for the Advancement of Military Medicine. Her accomplishments include building HIV programs in four countries from the ground up and seeing significant impact in the lives of the communities she supports. A former Peace Corps member in the South Pacific, Tiffany taught and led the science department at Pawa Secondary School in the Kingdom of Tonga. She has spearheaded the development of a new approach to managing AIDS and HIV as part of a month-long detail with the State Department in the Office of the U.S. Global AIDS Coordinator and Health Diplomacy.
