## Gallery Concerns:

Rachel Jensen: A couple of days after the email about thee racial incident happened on campus, a security officer shared insensitive Facebook posts. Students are concerned about this, worried that their complaint will not be taken seriously.

Tom Byerly: Officer has deleted the post. Has been addressed with him. If there is any concerns, please don't be afraid to call campus safety. Officer has been here 15 years and is

dedicated to the Mary Baldwin community and is here to support you despite different views on matters. Has also posted an apology on his Facebook.

Diamonique Anderson (MCU): I would also like to say that two ICC newsletters a week might be nice, especially to inform us about the weekend events. Maybe have a board as well? People can go post their flyers on that specific board. Additional concern about the Umoja House parking lot -- people are now double parking. Having an issue getting out of the parking lot, and a lot of freshmen are also parking there. Is there a way to designate this to House residents?

Ny'Erica (2018): Regarding flyers, you are allowed to post flyers anywhere except Hunt and Grafton. Clubs are responsible for taking their flyers down, and we are considering penalizing clubs if they do not take their flyers down in one-two days after the event.

Kirsten (BSA): A lot of students don't know about the ICC newsletter -- maybe there needs to be an email telling them that this is the way that events are advertised now.

Aaleyah: Will talk to Brent Douglass about the parking lot -- getting it designated to the House residents

Juanaysa (2019): Regarding the parking lots, does faculty pay for parking? Why are we being told that parking is a privilege

Byerly: It is called a privilege because you are not guaranteed a parking spot just because you are a student. The only place that is reserved for students is Sky 1. Some spots are reserved for fac/staff. The rest is general that is available to everyone. Fac/Staff do not pay for parking because it is included in their employment.

Aaleyah: Students do live here too, and in my opinion, it's a little unfair to have to walk across campus especially after hours and when lighting has been an issue. Is there a compromise we can reach? I will contact you.

Byerly: Security and Physical Plant do not get ticketed so that they can do their jobs. Ny'Erica: There were signs last year -- some were designated for faculty.

Byerly: Those are only 4 spots.

Grace (Gallery member): can advertise Sky 3 more? It's not very far from Kable, Pub, etc.

Ny'Erica (2018): If I'm moving my car there at night, I do not feel safe. If we advertise Sky 3 more, we also need to have more lighting there.

Megan (SGA Pres): A lot of students will not be returning in the Spring, and I would like to get senato and gallery feedback on what we can do to increase retention.

Grace: A lot of the issues are related to the quality of the dorms -- they do not match the quality of education I receive here.

Aaleyah: Struggling with funds.

Brenda (2020): I am considering transferring -- offering more scholarships would also

help

Nikayla (2017): Lack of events on the weekend

Rachel (Gallery Member): When we do have campus wide events, they're loud -- a lot of students don't attend them because of anxiety, etc. Want more diversity in terms of types of events.

Veronica (2017): Do think that BPB events need to be changed a little -- maybe send out a poll about the upcoming events?

Diamonique (MCU): We've also had less events this semester because of funding. Don't even have that many mixers -- mixer policy is incredibly extensive. Students don't feel like they have a social life.

Grace: Instead of having a lot of little events, friend at another small school has some big events. Instead of spending a money on a lot of lesser known artists, we could get one of two big bands or speakers.

Rachel: Haven't been able to go to BPB events because events are scheduled concurrently.

Aalyeah: That is always going to be a struggle.

Makela (2019): Feel like staff forgets that students are adults. The standard that we are upholding is losing us students. I think this is one of the main reasons students are transferring -- we have the diversity and the students -- and we don't collaborate with all our neighbouring colleges.

Erica (SGA Treasurer): I also do want to talk about the academics -- there have been issues with professors as well, and that has been slipping too. It's not only the social life.

Makela (2019): I also feel like I'm teaching myself in a lot of my classes. I want to be stimulated further. Certain departments are not up to par -- for example, I'm pre-med, and I'm losing out on competitive edge.

Sam (BPB Chair): Will be taking all feedback into consideration for Spring Semester. Do want to let everyone know that May Term is planned. We have colouring events because some people do need to destress. And if you come to our events, we have good turnout -- 102 people came to the dreamcatcher event.

Nikayla (2017): Is there any way you can send a poll to the whole school regarding events?

Sam: Yes.

Kirtsen: Does Senate have the ability to vote to decrease the amount of money BPB gets? If they're not able to reach the entire campus, maybe more money can go the clubs

Aaleyah: They're not part of the SAF, but it can be part of the discussion Makela: If the calendar is booked, is it not possible to have any more?

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Aaleyah: Also remember that you, as clubs, can also collaborate with branches of the EC.

Sam: We have lots of clubs that come to us to collaborate. We don't have a lot of leeway to collaborate. We try as much as we can. However, cannot just give out money. Brenda (2020): A lot of freshmen just sit in our rooms on the weekend, and if you don't

have a car, it's very hard. More weekend events -- clubs can collab over the weekend? Have bigger events?

Kirsten (BSA): Can it be advertised that EC is willing to collaborate? Need to communicate this more effectively.

Megan (SGA Pres): Each branch of EC has a different amount of money. We're not the appeals board -- some are willing to collaborate, but not every member is open to this because we all don't have the funds.

Madeleine (ICC): senators can also inform students who are having these concerns.

Grace: Lot of clubs are planning a lot of events in the Spring. LARP Club had an incident where a man wandered into the building and hit on students. It was very uncomfortable.

Aaleyah: Please call campus safety. Have to also be mindful that we are not an open campus.

Byerly: Safety was called, and officers did respond. Has been requested to stay out of the academic buildings.
